- ✓ The “piano di studio” is the annual university work plan for each student. It is the set of all exams you must take to graduate.

- ✓ When? Deadline for academic year 2023-2024: **from September 15th to October 20th hard deadline!**
- ✓ If you are not yet enrolled, you will be able to submit your study plan within 15 days after the confirmation of your enrolment.
- ✓ There are 2 different patterns: “standard” and “individuale”. Choose “standard” if you follow the syllabus and you do not include extra courses. Choose “individuale” if you want to include subjects not listed in the syllabus, or extra subjects.
- ✓ We recommend all students to choose a standard study plan. Individual study plans are possible only in exceptional cases and they must be approved by the programme board.

Piano di Studio STANDARD

Your study plan is **standard** when it is in line with the official current programme. Mandatory subjects are automatically already added to your study plan, but you can choose among some characterizing and elective subjects, as indicated in the following tables:

****Non-native Italian-speaking students without any previous certified knowledge of the Italian language must add to their study plan one of the courses “Italian language for foreign students LONG”, 5 ECTS. These courses are optional if you have an Italian-language certificate or if the language of instruction of your bachelor is Italian and this is certified by an official document or letter from the university.**

NOTE

If you don't save the choices by clicking “Salva insegnamenti selezionati”, the selected courses won't be in “piano di studi”.

If you don't confirm “piano di studi” at the end of the procedure, it won't be uploaded on your online profile.

CONCLUSION

After the compilation, by selecting “torna al piano”, you will see your academic plan and the total amount of ECTS (CFU in Italian). If you see red numbers probably your academic plan is not complete, and you must correct it.

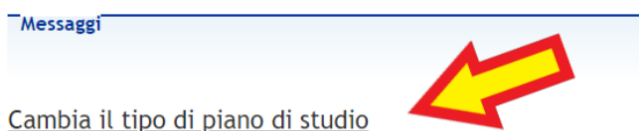
CHANGES TO STUDY PLAN AFTER SUBMISSION

Once the study plan is submitted, it is no longer possible to make changes. However, it is possible to request some changes within a specific schedule that is communicated each year. Be sure to ascertain whether your proposed changes produce allowed study plan, i.e. In terms of credits of various types. Upon submission and approval by the coordinator and the teaching office your study plan will be visible on your personal page.

Piano di Studio INDIVIDUALE

Your “piano di studio” is “individuale” when it is not in line with the official syllabus (e.g., you choose subjects not in the official programme or there are subjects you do not want to select).

- ✓ At the bottom of the page, click on the button “change the study plan pattern”:



- ✓ Fill in the whole list of subjects, including the compulsory ones, which are not automatically included. Add to your study plan the requested characterizing subjects (see above in the programme table) and ask to substitute any of the elective courses with a different UniGe course. Don't forget to specify all the courses attributes requested (e.g., the subject code, the type, and the number of credits)

- ✓ You can also add extra courses, classifying them with the label “fuori piano”. Remember that you can choose max 12 ECTS “fuori piano”. These courses will appear in your career, but they don’t count in the total amount of ECTS nor for the global average.
- ✓ Your choices will be submitted for approval.
- ✓ If your personal study plan is approved, you will be able to see it in your online page. If adjustments are necessary, the teaching office will contact you to redefine it.

Remember that non-native Italian-speaker students without any previous certified knowledge of the Italian language must add to their study plan one of the courses “Italian language for foreign students”, “brief” – 4 ECTS or “long”, 5 ECTS. These courses are optional if you have an Italian-language certificate or if the language of instruction of your bachelor is Italian and this is certified by an official document or letter from the university.

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
